<p><u>Staffing:</u> Elm Street School is excited for our Social Worker to begin serving our students. We are waiting for the state to approve their certification. Elm Street School is seeking the next principal to provide instructional leadership. While the hiring process takes place, an interim principal will assume the responsibility until the best candidate is found. A survey has been distributed to begin to collect information on what the staff and community is looking for in their next principal.</p> <p><u>Professional Development, School Wide Goals, and Curriculum:</u> The Elm Street School professional staff have begun the TPEG evaluation system by completing a self-assessment to determine strengths and areas of growth. We have set building goals this year around implementation of School-wide PBIS, formative assessment, and communication with the families and the community. We have also spent time reflecting on current practices in order to set professional goals as parts of the TPEG system. Our staff continues to work on implementation of Everyday Math 4, school-wide PBIS implementation, and beginning work on formative assessment. This coming month, we will begin to analyze data MEA and NWEA results.</p> <p><u>Building:</u> MCS has been experiencing a water pressure issue which needs to be addressed. A water pump has been ordered and once installed will bring the water pressure up to an adequate level to meet building needs. This month, the DOE conducted a site visit as part of the building application request for MCS. MCS was one of 80 buildings the team would be visiting. Overall our data is pretty similar to last year, with a one percent drop in the number of students meeting or exceeding standards in ELA, a one percent increase in our math results and a two percent increase in math. With 260 students tested in ELA and math, one percent represents three students, and with only the fifth grade tested for science one student represents about 1.5 percent. Our future work includes team time to analyze MEA and NWEA data and to look at the science and social studies units and assessments.</p> <p><u>Building: We are looking at some repairs and work on our playground, as some equipment may need to be removed due to age.
