In addition to our regular academic classes, we are working with community instructors to offer several enrichment classes from late January through May. Supporting Learners

- We added another graduate to our list at the end of November.
- Two of our students have enrolled in college classes for the upcoming semester after working with us to be better prepared for the transition, and we have supported another with enrollment at JobCorps in Limestone.
- We are also working with Community Concepts Workforce Program staff to assist a few students with placement into employment.
- In the next couple of weeks through the beginning of January, we are anticipating at least 6-8 new student enrollments.
