- USM CubeSat Design Competition 2023: Congratulations to our 8th grade CubeSat Design Team, *Cosmic Knights.* Their design proposal was one of six selected from middle school competitors across the state. The engineering challenge program requires students to design, build and launch a small satellite capable of going up to 130,000 feet in a high altitude balloon. Judges selected finalists after reviewing each team's design plan and mission statement which identified a problem, their objective and scientific or technological means of examining it. The final competition will be the balloon launch held at the end of May.
