Snow Days - We will need to reconsider this year's school calendar because of new instructions from the DOE. For a school day to count, the Federal Food Program has to operate in its traditional form. Meals must be offered within the school, served between 10 am and 2 pm, served in a congregate setting and consumed on site. Therefore, remote days are not possible because of these restrictions. This means we will need to have traditional snow days and not remote learning during snow days. I will bring a revised 2022-2023 school calendar for the Education Policy Subcommittee to consider at the end of the month, before it goes to the full school board next month.

MCS Boiler - 13 Electric Fireplaces were purchased to keep MCS classrooms warm as a short term solution. The fireplace heats 1,000 square feet; classrooms are about 900 square feet. The school's boiler end cap cracked and needs to be replaced. We have contacted the insurance company and are working to get a long term solution. Parts for this boiler are difficult to find, we have even had community members reach out and offer to help find the necessary parts to fix the boiler.
