Jenny Rose, Adult Ed Director - discussed the academic program leading to high school graduation, including brushing up on skills and English language learning. Demographics change from year to year, the younger (cohort this year 60%) are in the 16-20 year old age range, some students from beyond RSU 16 communities. Typically accepts 17 and older, can accept students age 16 with superintendent approval. Students demonstrate social emotional concerns including anxiety and depression. Attended the annual Superintendent's Conference sponsored by Drummon Woodsum on May 5, 2023.

Participated in the Celebration of Learning at PRHS on April 27 and 28, 2023. I was so impressed with the quality of the presentations. Congratulations to the high school staff and the senior class. National Educator Appreciation Day is May 9, 2023. Thank you to all our hard working educators. Also we celebrated National Administrative Assistants Day on April 26, 2023. Thank you to all our dedicated Administrative specialists. We also celebrated National School Nurses Day on May 6, 2023. Thank you to all our hard working nurses.

The \$5.1 million bond was defeated on May 2, 2023. Later in the meeting you will be asked to confirm the results of the failed bond. What I'm most interested in is what now? Where does RSU 16 go from here? I will offer a few suggestions short of praying for a mild winter. The board could go forward and engage in a tax exempt lease purchase agreement for all of the Minot project or a portion of the project (boiler only). The board could add \$2 million to the Capital Improvements Project Budget (no interest) and do a \$2 million project each year for the foreseeable future (starting with Minot). The board could pause and let the results of the new RSU 16 Task Force drive future maintenance and facility decisions. The board could do nothing and wait for the State to fund a new school for our elementary students. As you

can see there is no easy answer, in the meantime the administrative team will plan for the worst and hope for the best. An emergency plan is being drafted to minimize the shutdown time when and if the RSU needs to move student's from one building to another one that is heated.

#### 9.0 ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: (10 minutes)

Amy shared that it is state testing time for the NWEAs now known as the Maine Through Year assessment and the MEA Science assessment. Thursday, June 1st - the annual tradition of graduating seniors visiting their hometown elementary schools. Twelve teachers graduated from a district-sponsored UMF masters degree cohort. Celebrating Teacher Appreciation Week. July 11<sup>th</sup> - Aug 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday - Thursday summer school programs at PRHS, BWMS, and at PCS, ESS through Title I funding.
