MELDS

Maine's Early Learning and Development Standards Maine Department of Education

Research and practice are constantly informing the field of education and Maine's Early Learning and Development Standards (MELDS) reflects the most current knowledge to date. The Maine Early Learning and Development Standards is designed to target early learning and development from a holistic approach and is divided into 8 areas of learning and development:

- ★ Social and Emotional Development
- ★ Approaches to Learning
- ★ Creative Arts
- ★ Early Language and literacy
- ★ Physical Development and Health
- ★ Math
- ★ Science
- ★ Social Studies



Pre-k 101

- RSU #16 offers Pre-K in all three of the elementary schools
- Minot and Elm Street both offer a morning and an afternoon session
- PCS may offer additional sessions, if needed based on enrollment numbers.
- Each session can typically accommodate 16 children
- Each classroom has one certified teacher and one educational technician
- The program runs on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays (Wednesdays are a day for staff to communicate with families and prepare curriculum)
- Each session runs for approximately 2 % hours on the scheduled days



Pre-K 101 Continued...

- The Pre-K programs will align to the elementary school calendar (with the exception of no Pre-K on Wednesdays). However, we anticipate starting about a week after the general elementary population begins. This will give Pre-K teaching staff an opportunity to conduct meet and greets with each child and their family.
- If your child has special needs or you think may require speech, physical, or occupational therapy services, CDS (Child Development Services) will provide those services. Please reach out to CDS at your earliest convenience to get the conversation started.
- Pre-K uses Seesaw as an online platform for home/school connection. Seesaw will primarily be used as a communication tool between parents and teachers.



Pre-K 101 Continued...Who can Attend?

- Children who live within RSU #16 (Poland, Mechanic Falls, or Minot) and who turn 4 prior to October 15, 2024 are eligible to apply for admission to the Pre-K program.
- A child will not be considered enrolled until all paperwork has been submitted to the school office. The deadline for registration is Friday, May 17th, 2024.
- After children who live in RSU #16 have been accepted into the program, the Superintendent may accept additional children outside of our district.

Paperwork needed



- *Registration Form
- Birth Certificate
- *Transportation Form
- Proof of Residency (a service that shows your physical address like a CMP bill, lease agreement, tax bill, fuel bill, and it must be current no more than 60 days old) or Good Faith Letter.
- Immunization Record (can be faxed to your school)

Transportation



Transportation for Pre-K is available for morning and afternoon sessions, to and from school

AM/PM sessions are determined based on transportation

The Session Placement for Morning and Afternoon sessions are determined by Transportation-Your pick up and drop of location.

The Transportation Request Form is a **required** part of your child's packet in order for us to provide them with a Pre-K slot.

Session placement requests: We do try our best to accommodate families, however, due to transportation routes, this is not always possible.

Parent Transport: If you will be transporting your child and you are requesting a specific session, you will be notified in August of your session placement. We need to accommodate families that require transportation prior to addressing the session placement requests.

Transportation changes: If your transportation needs change over the summer or into the school year, you will need to contact the transportation department as soon as possible. We will make every effort to work with your family to minimize program and transportation disruptions.

Bus Safety: We will teach children about bus safety and also share this information with families so that you can reinforce safe bus behavior, too.


- 5-10 minute lessons taught daily

Independence

Our job in Pre-K is to get your child ready for Kindergarten, this includes building independence. The more your child can do independently, the easier their day at Pre-K will be.

When buying clothing for your Pre-K student please try to remember these couple of tips

- Velcro shoes are way easier than tie.
- Leggings and sweatpants are easier than buttons when using the bathroom.
- Please purchase a backpack that is large enough to hold, a folder, lunchbox, and extra clothes.



Meet and greet

As we get closer to the start of the school year, your child's teacher will be in touch with you about scheduling a Meet and Greet.

This is an opportunity for you and your child to explore the classroom, ask and answer questions, and allow teaching staff to get to know your child so that they can plan accordingly for your child's needs and interests.
