SUMMER SCHOOL

Yes, it's only December, but students can do a few things now to avoid attending summer school next July. Summer school is available to students who struggled to meet standards in their core courses (math, ELA, social studies, and science) but who attended class regularly. Students attend for as long as it takes to make up the standards, often just a few days of work, sometimes as long as four weeks.

Students who did not meet standards due to excessive unexcused absences or tardies are NOT eligible for summer school. Students who are not eligible for summer school will make up the missing credit by retaking the course, which may delay graduation, or by staying after school in credit recovery.

Administrators and school counselors make the decision regarding summer school, repeating courses, and credit recovery. Please encourage your child to attend class, complete work, and seek help when they need it. We're hoping everyone can enjoy a relaxing July!

AFTER SCHOOL TIME - TUESDAYS AND THURSDAYS

Beginning Tuesday November 15th, students who are repeatedly tardy to school, late to classes, or missing full class blocks will be requested to make up the time in after school detention until 3:30p. Email notification of this make-up will be sent to families at least the day before the student's scheduled after school session.

This was an event we have participated in since PRHS opened in 1999; it was on hold during the pandemic and we are excited to get back to introducing our sophomores to career opportunities. Students started with online career inventories to help them select 3 sessions that they would be interested in listening to. <u>FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE</u> is still on the radar for the Class of 2023. In order to be eligible for free tuition and fees from any of the 7 community colleges in Maine the student must:

- 1.) Apply to the <u>community college</u>. Each community college has its own online application and we find it takes most students 10-15 minutes to complete.
- 2.) Do the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The Finance Authority of Maine (FAME) has the best resources to get you started. Their materials, websites, and videos will walk you through step by step.

That's it! Students will need to let their counselor know that they have applied, so that we can send their transcript. Contact your student's school counselor if you have any questions.

LEWISTON REGIONAL TECHNICAL CENTER - The admissions process for LRTC will start soon! All sophomores will hear a presentation about LRTC on January 11 during RT. Any students (sophomores or juniors) interested in visiting LRTC will be able to go on the trip in early February. Applications will be due February 17, 2023. More information will be coming in the next newsletter.

Students interested in the new <u>Upward Bound</u> program or <u>JROTC</u> at Lewiston HS should check in with their school counselor for more information on both programs. I highlighted both of these in last month's newsletter. These are great opportunities beyond PRHS!

Second semester is coming! January 20, 2023 will be the end of semester 1 and January 23 will start semester 2. Grades and credits will be posted to transcripts at the end of January. Students can check with their counselor now about their courses and any potential changes for next semester.

Health Office

Just a friendly reminder to please complete the <u>Annual Health Update</u> and the <u>Standing Medical Orders Permission Form</u> for your student. These forms need to be completed annually. Your student should return the completed paperwork to the nurse's office or to their roundtable teacher. Prompt return of these papers will allow us to better care for your student while at school. We will not be able to administer standing order medications if we do not have a signed permission form for your student.

COVID TEST KITS

The health office continues to distribute free Siemen Clinitest rapid antigen home tests for Covid 19 to all of our symptomatic RSU 16 employees and students. There are 5 home tests contained in each box. Sieman has just extended the shelf life of these test kits. If the boxes are lot # of 2202077EUA with an expiration date of 2022-12, you may cross that off and write in a new expiration date of 2024-01 (January of 2024). This will allow you to continue to use those remaining tests in their boxes for episodes of future symptoms where testing for Covid might be indicated. If someone has a Clinitest box with a different lot number, please reach out to Dotty Bagley at dbagley@rsu16.org, Dotty will happily cross reference their number to the list of lot numbers that Sieman has shared.

Please continue to report to the school nurse if your student has tested positive for COVID-19. Thank you.
