Hello PRHS student and families,

This winter has been busy at the high school as teachers and students worked to complete evidence of learning in semester 1 and begin semester 2 among the flurry of snow days in the middle of the month. Teachers have completed the grading for their courses and grades are available in JumpRope, Infinite Campus and paper copies of report cards have been mailed home.

- Alumni Day was a big success with over thirty former PRHS students from a wide range of graduation classes speaking with current students about their education and work experiences.
- The sophomore class attended a career fair at CMCC and sophomores interested in LRTC for next year went to visit the programs in action.
- Mrs. Fryda's Comparative Government and Economics classes hosted a guest speaker, Tim Winkeler, President
 and CEO of VIP Tires and Service, presented his work on a citizen initiative to get a right-to-repair law on the
 books in Maine. Mr. Winkeler engaged with students about the steps it takes to get a question on the ballot,
 including the petition process, funding, and the use of media. Students declared the presentation "cool,"
 "thought-provoking," and "informative."
- PRHS has earned the College Board's AP* Computer Science Female Diversity Award for expanding young women's access to AP Computer Science Principles (CSP). This award acknowledges 1,105 schools for their work toward equal gender representation during the 2021-22 school year. PRHS is one of 832 schools to be recognized for achieving this important result in AP CSP.
- The high school Functional Life Skills classes hosted an informational open house for FLS students and parents to share more information about daily schedules, routines, and classroom learning.

This week is our annual Winter Carnival. Each day has a dress up theme and Friday will be a day of school spirit and community building activities. Friday evening 7-10p the eligible students have an opportunity to attend a school dance. Students need to have a positive week of class participation and meeting behavior expectations to be eligible for the dance. In addition, we have been talking with the students that this is a "chem free" event. Students attending the dance are expected to make healthy, safe choices and meet the same behavior expectations as a school day. If students do not meet these expectations, families will be notified to pick their student up from the dance.

TECHNOLOGY

Reminder Parents: When paying online for Technology Fees, under Transactions, please make sure to select **Technology Related Fees** before completing the transaction. If you have other dues you need to pay for your student, please select the appropriate transaction for that payment ie: High School fees other or Middle School Fees other. Please <u>do not pay</u> <u>all fees under High School fees or Middle School Fees</u>. Thank you!

SUMMER SCHOOL

Yes, it's only February, but students can do a few things now to avoid attending summer school next July. Summer school is available to students who struggled to meet standards in their core courses (math, ELA, social studies, and science) but who attended class regularly. Students attend for as long as it takes to make up the standards, often just a few days of work, sometimes as long as four weeks.

Students who did not meet standards due to excessive unexcused absences or tardies are NOT eligible for summer school. Students who are not eligible for summer school will make up the missing credit by retaking the course, which may delay graduation, or by staying after school in credit recovery.

Administrators and school counselors make the decision regarding summer school, repeating courses, and credit recovery. Please encourage your child to attend class, complete work, and seek help when they need it. We're hoping everyone can enjoy a relaxing July!

<u>PRHS list of scholarships</u> - check this now and then continue to check it often! New scholarships will continually be added throughout the school year.

FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE is still on the radar for the Class of 2023. In order to be eligible for free tuition and fees from any of the 7 community colleges in Maine the student must:

- 1.) Apply to the <u>community college</u>. Each community college has its own online application and we find it takes most students 10-15 minutes to complete.
- 2.) Do the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The Finance Authority of Maine (FAME) has the best resources to get you started. Their materials, websites, and videos will walk you through step by step.
- 3.) Plan to attend full time with 4-5 classes.. Remember that full time in college looks different than it does for high school.

That's it! Students will need to let their counselor know that they have applied, so that we can send their transcript. Contact your student's school counselor if you have any questions.

LEWISTON REGIONAL TECHNICAL CENTER - We are in the thick of the LRTC Application process. LRTC presented to all sophomores and interested juniors on January 11. The steps to apply are highlighted here. We suggest that students apply online by Feb 17, 2023 (however, applications will still be accepted after that date). All sophomores should have received a copy of LRTC's brochure of programs in the mail. New programs for next year include Cosmetology, EMT, and Precision Machining (this program will be held at Central ME Community College). Final decisions for placement in LRTC programs will be mailed to students during April break. Students can contact their counselor for more information.

<u>Grades 9-11</u> will start their course registration process soon! This means previewing their own transcripts for credits, as well as reviewing PRHS graduation requirements in RT. We will have the Course of Studies updated soon. You will see the list of courses that your student chooses at Student Led Conferences in March.

CONSIDER ENGINEERING at UMaine is a 4 day FREE summer program for juniors. This has been the best way for our juniors to delve into what engineering and its various fields are all about. Go to UMaine Pulp & Paper Foundation to apply online. You will need to write a letter and get one letter of recommendation. Dates are: July 9-12, July 16-19, or July 23-26. Application is due April 15.

Winter is a tough time of year for many households. Here is a <u>link</u> to resources for help with home heating. School counselors and social workers across our district are ready to help families find the resources they need. We partner with <u>Pink Feather Foundation</u> year round to help make sure our students have the needed clothes, outerwear, and shoes/boots for all seasons. Health Office

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Just a friendly reminder to please complete the <u>Annual Health Update</u> and the <u>Standing Medical Orders Permission Form</u> for your student. These forms need to be completed annually. Your student should return the completed paperwork to the nurse's office or to their roundtable teacher. Prompt return of these papers will allow us to better care for your student while at school. We will not be able to administer standing order medications if we do not have a signed permission form for your student.

MCV4

We will be sending out reminder letters in the coming weeks for all students that will need their MCV4 (Meningococcal Meningitis Vaccine) prior to 12th grade entry. One dose of quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4) is required for students entering grade seven. Any student entering grade twelve is required to have received two doses of MCV4. The first dose must have been received on or after the eleventh birthday, and the second dose must have been received on or after the sixteenth birthday, at least eight weeks after the first dose. However, if the first dose is administered when the student is sixteen years of age or older, only one dose is required. Please reach out to the nurses office if you have any questions.

COVID TEST KITS

The health office continues to distribute free Siemen Clinitest rapid antigen home tests for Covid 19 to all of our symptomatic RSU 16 employees and students. There are 5 home tests contained in each box. Sieman has just extended the shelf life of these test kits. If the boxes are lot # of 2202077EUA with an expiration date of 2022-12, you may cross that off and write in a new expiration date of 2024-01 (January of 2024). This will allow you to continue to use those remaining tests in their boxes for episodes of future symptoms where testing for Covid might be indicated. If someone has a Clinitest box with a different lot number, please reach out to Dotty Bagley at dbagley@rsu16.org, Dotty will happily cross reference their number to the list of lot numbers that Sieman has shared.

Please continue to report to the school nurse if your student has tested positive for COVID-19. Thank you.
