CLASS OF 2027! We welcome our incoming 9th grade! We have kicked off events to welcome and help the class of 2027 prepare to enter PRHS this fall. The counselors will be working with students over the next few weeks. **8th GRADE PARENT/GUARDIAN NIGHT was on Wednesday, March 8 at 6 PM in the PRHS Auditorium.** This will be an overview of graduation requirements and how high school works, including tours of the building.

<u>PRHS list of scholarships</u> - check this now and then continue to check it <u>often</u>! New scholarships will continually be added throughout the school year.

FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE is still on the radar for the Class of 2023. In order to be eligible for free tuition and fees from any of the 7 community colleges in Maine the student must:

- 1.) Apply to the <u>community college</u>. Each community college has its own online application and we find it takes most students 10-15 minutes to complete.
- 2.) Do the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The Finance Authority of Maine (FAME) has the best resources to get you started. Their materials, websites, and videos will walk you through step by step.
- 3.) Plan to attend full time with 4-5 classes. Remember that full time in college looks different than it does for high school.

That's it! Students will need to let their counselor know that they have applied, so that we can send their transcript. Contact your student's school counselor if you have any questions.

PRHS AND ADULT ED CLASSES OF 2020, 2021, 2022 - You can still access <u>FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE</u> now! As long as the funding is still available, you will need to be enrolled by Spring 2024. It is the same process as above for 2023. **Just do it!**

LEWISTON REGIONAL TECHNICAL CENTER - We are in the thick of the LRTC Application process. LRTC presented to all sophomores and interested juniors on January 11. The steps to apply are highlighted <u>here</u>. We suggest that students apply online by Feb 17, 2023 (however, applications will still be accepted after that date). All sophomores should have received a copy of LRTC's brochure of programs in the mail. New programs for next year include <u>Cosmetology</u>, <u>EMT</u>, and <u>Precision Machining</u> (this program will be held at Central ME Community College). Final decisions for placement in LRTC programs will be mailed to students during April break. Students can contact their counselor for more information.

JROTC (Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps) is available at Lewiston HS for interested PRHS students. We currently have students who attend JROTC at LHS for two blocks every other day. Students travel via the LRTC bus to get to Lewiston HS. While this is an Air Force JROTC program, students are not committed to any branch of the military. This program gives them experience, leadership and drills training, as well as aeronautical training. For more information, students should check in with their school counselor.

<u>Grades 9-11</u> are in the midst of their course registration process now! This means previewing their own transcripts for credits, as well as reviewing PRHS graduation requirements in RT. We have the <u>Course of Studies</u> updated now. You will see the list of courses that your student chooses at Student Led Conferences in March.

CONSIDER ENGINEERING at UMaine is a 4 day FREE summer program for juniors. This has been the best way for our juniors to delve into what engineering and its various fields are all about. Go to <u>UMaine Pulp & Paper Foundation</u> to apply online. You will need to write a letter and get one letter of recommendation. Dates are: July 9-12, July 16-19, or July 23-26. Application is due April 15. See your school counselor for more information. *In late February, the Center for Disease Control released a report on Youth Risk Behavior from 2011-2021. One of the major findings was the dramatic increase in percentage of teenage girls who felt persistent sadness or hopelessness - nearly 57% in 2021 up from 36% in 2011. The interesting note is that this trend began in 2012, with the increased prevalence of social media. Males also reported an increase in hopelessness but not at the same rate as females. If you are worried about your student's mental health, please reach out to their school counselor. Here are a couple of articles to learn more about how to help a teen with depression and the potential correlation between <u>social media and teen mental health</u>.*

Health Office

Just a friendly reminder to please complete the <u>Annual Health Update</u> and the <u>Standing Medical Orders Permission Form</u> for your student. These forms need to be completed annually. Your student should return the completed paperwork to the nurse's office or to their roundtable teacher. Prompt return of these papers will allow us to better care for your student while at school. We will not be able to administer standing order medications if we do not have a signed permission form for your student.

School Oral Health Program

The Maine Oral Health Program will be at PRHS on March 8, 2023 to provide dental screenings and fluoride applications for students with parental permission. Please complete the permission form, <u>Maine School Oral Health</u>, and return to the nurses office by March 8 if you would like your student to receive these services.

COVID-19 Testing At School

We continue to provide COVID-19 testing for symptomatic students and staff at school. Please complete the permission form, <u>COVID-19 Testing Permission Test</u>, and return to the nurses office if you would like testing available if your student develops symptoms during the school day.

COVID TEST KITS

The health office continues to distribute free Siemen Clinitest rapid antigen home tests for Covid 19 to all of our symptomatic RSU 16 employees and students. There are 5 home tests contained in each box. Sieman has just extended the shelf life of these test kits. If the boxes are lot # of 2202077EUA with an expiration date of 2022-12, you may cross that off and write in a new expiration date of 2024-01 (January of 2024). This will allow you to continue to use those remaining tests in their boxes for episodes of future symptoms where testing for Covid might be indicated. If someone has a Clinitest box with a different lot number, please reach out to Dotty Bagley at <u>dbagley@rsu16.org</u>, Dotty will happily cross reference their number to the list of lot numbers that Sieman has shared. Please continue to report to the school nurse if your student has tested positive for COVID-19.

MCV4

We have sent out reminder letters for all students that will need their MCV4 (Meningococcal Meningitis Vaccine) prior to 12th grade entry. One dose of quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4) is required for students entering grade seven. Any student entering grade twelve is required to have received two doses of MCV4. The first dose must have been received on or after the eleventh birthday, and the second dose must have been received on or after the sixteenth birthday, at least eight weeks after the first dose. However, if the first dose is administered when the student is sixteen years of age or older, only one dose is required. Please reach out to the nurses office if you have any questions and update us once your student has received their vaccine.
