Class of 2025 - <u>11th grade Parent Night</u> is Wednesday, March 13 at 6 PM in the Auditorium. Come hear about the college admissions and financial aid process.

The **Maine Turismo** will visit colleges around Portland on **April 11**. It will be offered to juniors only, first come first serve. This is a great chance to visit a range of colleges in person. This is a part of our MELMAC grant. Stay tuned for sign up information coming soon!

The <u>Senior Calendar</u> is your one-stop place for all information for seniors. <u>Scholarship list</u> is here.

FAFSAs - Hey Senior families! The **FAFSA** (<u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>) is available now! **HOWEVER, the information will not be shared to colleges until mid to late March.** It has been wonky but they are working out the glitches. Students and parents can each get their FSA IDs now at <u>studentaid.gov</u>; this takes 2-3 days to process. Find more information on our <u>website</u>. <u>FAME</u> will also have more information and training around the new FAFSA. RIght now FAME offers 30 minute free financial aid coaching for families at <u>Free FAFSA</u> <u>Help with FAME</u>.

FREE COLLEGE is here for the classes of **2024** and **2025**! The process is easy - apply to one of the Maine community colleges, do your FAFSA, enroll full time. The classes of 2020-2023 can still access the free college option as well! Class of 2020-2021 - enroll no later than during the '23-'24 academic year Class of 2022 - enroll no later than during the '24-'25 academic year Class of 2023 - enroll no later than during the '25-'26 academic year At this point the class of 2025 is the LAST class to be eligible for free community college in Maine.

COURSE REGISTRATION - the work has started this week. Students select the courses they want to take so that we can start to build our master schedule from there. Last week and this week counselors are visiting Roundtables daily to help students choose their classes and put them into Infinite Campus. Families will sign off on the selections during Student Led Conferences. Updated information will be shared <u>here</u>. There are many new courses being offered for 2024-2025, including *Maine Forestry, Fisheries, and Wildlife; Intro to Social Sciences; AP Spanish Language; and Nets & Racquets,* plus more!

Lewiston Regional Technical Center - this process has started and students can check with their counselor about applying. Final decisions will be mailed during April vacation.

Other options for next year include Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) at Lewiston HS, AP4ME offering AP courses that PRHS does not, early college classes through the University of Maine system or Maine Community College system, as well as other colleges. Students can contact their counselor to get more information.

Health Office Update

*COVID-19 Guidance as of March 2024:

The latest CDC recommendation says that we can now start treating COVID-19 like other respiratory illnesses. (US CDC issued <u>this press release</u>). We no longer require isolation and masking for COVID.

- If a staff member or student has symptoms of a respiratory illness or COVID, call the school nurse or district nurse.
- Students or staff whose symptoms have improved and have been fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing medication can return to school or work and resume normal activities. There is no isolation period for COVID it is about if your symptoms have improved and you are fever-free. Stay home if you are sick or not improving.
- It is encouraged, not required that during the five (5) days after resuming normal activities a mask be worn.
- RSU 16 will support personal choice for masking. Masks are available upon request in the nurses' office.

 RSU 16 will offer the administration of COVID tests to students who become symptomatic during the school day. To access free rapid antigen testing in their school nurses' office, a signed <u>Consent to Test</u> <u>Binax NOW</u> must be on file.

As part of the guidance, CDC provides recommendations on core prevention steps and strategies:

- Staying <u>up to date with vaccination</u> to protect people against serious illness, hospitalization, and death. This includes flu, COVID-19, and RSV if eligible.
- Practicing good hygiene by covering coughs and sneezes, washing or sanitizing hands often, and cleaning frequently touched surfaces.
- Taking steps for cleaner air, such as bringing in more fresh outside air, purifying indoor air, or gathering outdoors.
